Psalm 34:1-3

I will always thank the LORD; I will never stop praising him.

² I will praise him for what he has done; may all who are oppressed listen and be glad!

³ Proclaim with me the LORD's greatness; let us praise his name together!

Intro

This is our final week of thinking about praise. We have had a peek into heaven with John. We've seen that heaven is full of praise for God, because he is holy, and because he has made everything. We have seen that heaven is full of praise for Jesus because he died for us and was the only one who was good enough to complete all of God's plans for the world.

Our Passage,

Our passage this week shows us how and when David, someone who loved God praised. It helps us see how we can praise God. We are told in our bibles that Psalm 34 is an acrostic poem, David took every letter of the Hebrew alphabet, and wrote a sentence of praise to God beginning with that letter.

Never stop praising God always, in good times and bad times. V1 ESV- I will bless the Lord at all times.

We're also told that David wrote this psalm when he had recently heard that Saul was trying to kill him. He had been living in the King's palace, and he had to run away, leaving his best friend Jonathan behind, and his reputation (1 Sam 21:21-14)-he had to pretend to be incapable of being in charge of an army.

David is praising God in times that are bad for him.

David never stops praising God

We, especially children have crazes, a TV programme, a new hobby, a new game in the playground. These things are fun and it's okay to move on from one thing to another, but praising God should never be a craze we grow out of, or probably more realistically as parents, a craze we need to grow into.

Thank God for what He has done. V2

Thanking God is one way to praise him, especially thanking him for what he has done. One of the activities for today is for the children and young people to write their own acrostic, thanking God for all that he has done.

Praise God together. V3

This isn't easy at the moment, but families can praise God together It is a good thing, although not always easy in every home, for and sons and daughters being involved with, or watching parents praise God (singing songs, reading the bible, praying)

Ask God to help you remember to praise Him in bad times.




